



In response to the growing need to improve and expand services to our veterans and military service members, the Commonwealth of Virginia established the Virginia Wounded Warrior Program (VWWP) in 2008. VWWP coordinates support services for veterans with stress-related and traumatic brain injuries resulting from service in a combat area. The program ensures that these veterans and their families receive timely assessment, treatment, and support.

Regional coalitions of community services boards, brain injury services providers, and other public and private service providers are offering services across the Commonwealth. These coalitions will enhance the existing array of services in their communities based on an ongoing assessment of local needs.
